Mayor Rex called the meeting to order with the following Council in attendance: Flink, Hoefling, Bengford, Scott and Hemphill. Also in attendance were: Supt. Bill Tysor and Chief Bruce Henderson.

Moved by Flink and seconded by Hoefling to approve the agenda. All ayes. Moved by Hoefling and seconded by Scott to approve the minutes of the December meeting. All ayes. Moved by Flink and seconded by Hoefling to approve the bills as presented. All ayes.

Moved by Hoefling and seconded by Flink to approve the application of Liaison's Inc. for a Class C Liquor License. All ayes.

The following Ordinance was introduced by Councilperson Hemphill. Following discussion it was moved by Hemphill that the rule requiring three readings at three different meetings be waived and that said ordinance come on for immediate consideration, and be adopted. Said motion was seconded by Flink. Roll call vote: Five ayes. The Mayor then put the motion to adopt the ordinance to a vote with the following results: five ayes.

The Mayor declared the motion carried, and the Ordinance adopted

Ordinance No. 01.07

An Ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Odebolt, to establish unit-based pricing for the collection of residential solid waste and recyclables.

Whereas, the Sac County Solid Waste Agency has failed to meet the state's 25% reduction goal pursuant to Iowa Code Section 455D.3; and

Whereas, the City of Odebolt is a member of the above mentioned agency and must establish unit-based pricing pursuant to Iowa Code 567 Chapter 101.13(8);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Odebolt, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Chapter 106.02, *Collection Services*, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Odebolt are amended as follows:

Per stipulation by the Iowa State Code, 567 Chapter 101.13(8) - required unit-based pricing system, by the deadline of June 12, 2007. The City must now regulate the amount of trash each residential household/commercial establishment may place at the curbside in the city limits of Odebolt. Each household will be allowed 2 (2) thirty (30) gallon trash bags of solid waste per week, not to exceed 60 gallons per week. Each bag or container must not exceed 40 (40) pounds in weight. Any additional waste over the 60 gallons must have a city-approved tag/sticker securely affixed to each bag or container. The tag/sticker must be obtained from the City Clerk's office prior to trash collection day and will cost one dollar (\$1.00) per tag/sticker in lots of 10.

The haulers will not pick up any bag or can exceeding the 60-gallon per household limit without the proper tag/sticker.

Unique items that do not meet the bag/container requirements shall also be subject to a reasonable fee set by the City based on the cost to remove the item. The reasonable fee shall be based on the weight of the item, and any special removal or disposal costs associated with the disposal of the item. These items must bear pre-purchased tags, which can be obtained at City Hall, in order to be picked up by the haulers.

Section 2. **REPEALER.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. **SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.** If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such as adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 4. **WHEN EFFECTIVE.** This ordinance shall be in effect June 1, 2007 after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Passed by the Council this 2nd day of January, 2007 and approved this 2nd day of January, 2007.

It was noted that there still are residents and businesses that are not recycling as much as they could. We really need the cooperation of all to keep down the costs of the landfill.

There will be a special meeting on February 12, 2007 at 6:00 p.m. to finalize the budget for FY2008.

Nuisances and delinquent bills were discussed and action will be taken.

Supt. Bill Tysor reported that with the installation of a break switch, the garbage truck is currently working. It is hoped that a \$1500 computer will not need to be replaced on this. The snowplow will require about \$400.00 in repairs.

Hoefling inquired about additional water line to the Pat and Ann Hoefling residence.

Moved by Flink and seconded by Hemphill to adopt Resolution #07.01 – a resolution to re-hire the firm of Dresselhuis and Heidenreich as City Attorney and to re-appoint, re-hire all current employees at their current wages. All ayes.

Thank yous were read from Jack and Carol Bensley and the Delmar Reis Family.

The Council commended the street crew on the good job of snow removal this past snowfall.

As the Odebolt Chamber has been dissolved, there was concern and discussion about Christmas activities for next year.

At 8:07 p.m. it was moved by Hemphill and seconded by Hoefling to adjourn. All ayes.
